MINUTES Lancaster County Planning Commission September 20, 2022 6:00 p.m.

Chairman Deese called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

1. **ROLL CALL**: Quorum is present (4 Commissioners)

The following press were notified of the meeting by email in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act: The Lancaster News, Kershaw News Era, The Rock Hill Herald, The Fort Mill Times, Cable News 2, Channel 9, and the local Government Channel. The agenda was also posted in the lobby of the County Administration Building for the required length of time, and was published on the County website.

2. APPROVE AGENDA

Chairman Deese called for a motion to approve the Agenda. Motion to Approve by A.Patterson; 2nd by T. Neely Motion to Amend, deferring Item 4b: 9/1/2022 Workshop Minutes, and removing Item 5f: RZ-2022-1566 Chernyak (Withdrawn): by S. Hinson 2nd by A. Patterson.

<u>Called vote on amendment</u>: 4:0. **Amendment approved unanimously** <u>Called vote on approval of agenda as amended:</u> 4:0. **Motion approved unanimously**.

3. <u>CITIZEN'S COMMENTS</u> [see Sign-In sheet attached]

Chairman Deese opened the floor to comments from the public. None signed in. Citizen's comments closed.

4. APPROVE MINUTES

a. August 16, 2022 Regular Minutes

Chairman Deese called for a motion to approve August 16, 2022 Regular Minutes as written. **Motion to Approve** by Alan Patterson; 2nd by Sheila Hinson. Called vote: 4:0. **Motion approved unanimously**

b. September 1, 2022 Workshop Minutes

Deferred to October 18, 2022. Lack of quorum: Commissioner Patterson was absent on 9/1/2022.

5. PUBLIC ITEMS

a. RZ-2022-1527 Arbor Walk LLC

Application by Arbor Walk, LLC to rezone approximately 112.5 acres located at or adjacent to 2991 Vance Baker Road (TM# 0009-00-015.00) from Low Density Residential (LDR) to Medium Density Residential to create a 179-lot single-family residential development.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Rox Burhans, Development Services Director presented the application consistent with the staff report. Noted that a letter was received on Monday September 19, 2022 from HOA attorneys, highlighting concerns about deed restrictions on the conveyance of the Pump Station parcel.

<u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Due to uncertain or incomplete matters in application and plan, staff recommends denial.

Questions to staff:

A. Patterson asked if this development would be subject to impact fees; **Burhans** confirmed that it would.

A. Patterson asked what improvements were recommended for Vance Baker Road in the TIA; **Burhans** noted that only incidental improvements at intersections were recommended – DOT does not generally require consideration on road width.

Attorney DuBose noted that the TIA is predicated on the assumption of placement of access/entrances at Vance Baker and S. Legacy Park/Pump station.

Chairman Deese asked Public Works Director **Jeff Catoe** to speak about the condition of Vance Baker Road.

Jeff Catoe: The condition of Vance Baker has been a concern for some time. Fifteen years ago when problems first arose, a study was done on the feasibility of widening the road; right-of-ways on private properties and utilities easements make widening problematic.

Comment from applicant(s):

Jeff Jernigan (Developer): Applicant is still working on rights to second access (pump station parcel). They have listened to community concerns, and are actively engaged in efforts to address concerns. With current LDR zoning, they could develop up to 169 homes; the proposed requests is a minimal amount over that, the least that could be derived from MDR zoning, allowing them to preserve a lot of the natural features of the site. They have offered to improve Vance Baker wherever that can be accomplished, and install a variety of traffic calming devices e.g. lights and speed bumps on S. Legacy Park Drive.

Chaplain Spencer (Attorney for developer): The Development Agreement process allows time and means to mitigate the impact of concerns that have been raised. The project is consistent with development in the surrounding area, and is less dense than the surrounding communities. Willing to negotiate on conditions attached for approval.

Peter Tatge (ESP Engineering): County requires new roads in developments to be privately maintained. They are willing to work with the County to make improvement on access roads; the funding strategy for such improvements is in development. Negotiations are ongoing over traffic amendments such as crosswalks, flashing signs, and pedestrian islands. Asking for conditional approval over denial.

Questions from Commissioners:

T. Neely: Would developer consider deferring until some access issues are resolved? **Peter Tatge and Jeff Jernigan** responded that they would like to move forward.

Public Hearing: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets)

<u>Cole McNeal</u> (Lives in the parcel facing pump station site):

- Parcel was never intended as road access, he designed and built his home oriented to the view;
- Safety will be severely impacted if a road goes through there.

MaryAnn MacNeal: No additional comments

Jean McMullen (Foxwood Court): 3 safety concerns:

- At the intersection of N. Legacy, S. Legacy and Shelly Mullis, speed and overgrown vegetation/visibility are already a problem and will only get worse;
- Goldwing and Vance Baker are not up to standard;

 Crosswalk from N. Legacy to S. Legacy is already very dangerous and will get worse.

Frances Liu: (E. Oxford Court)

- The current proposal is for 179 lots, but once the area is opened developers will want to build on other land adjacent to it, creating an even bigger traffic burden;
- No other development in the County allows access exclusively through another existing development;
- They have not protested other recent nearby developments; their concern is specifically with the design of this one.

Michelle Simonetti: (Arbor Walk HOA) [see attached slide presentation]

- Both proposed outlets do not yet exist;
- The single lane road serving one proposed outlet [Vance Baker] is underdeveloped, and cannot support existing traffic;
- Access would go through an already established neighborhood;
- None of the connecting roads to Legacy Park support construction vehicles
- Lack of sidewalks in existing neighborhood would create safety hazard;

Jay Jacob (S. Legacy Park):

Concurs with stated concerns: existing traffic and safety are already a concern, development would create even more hazards.

Deborah Wasylchak and **Lyle Wasylchak** yielded time to Michelle Simonetti **Susan Sanderson** and **Larry Sanderson** yielded time to Michelle Simonetti

Rebecca Guzman: Chose Legacy Park specifically because of childrens' safety concerns. Development would radically change the safety of the neighborhood.

Chairman Deese called for response from applicants:

<u>Peter Tatge</u>; We have heard the communities concerns loud and clear, and are actively responding, going above and beyond TIA and SCDOT requirements to propose solutions. **Traffic Engineer**: the counts for the TIA were done June 8, 2021, the last day of school for the Senior High was June 10th by the State's calendar. SCDOT does not allow counts when school is not in session. Also, the scope of the analysis takes into account future development and improvements already slated, such as the traffic circle on Shelly Mullis.

<u>Jeff Jernigan</u>: We want to do what's in the best interest of the community, and will work with the Planning staff, Public Works and the neighborhood to accommodate within reason.

Chairman Deese closed Public hearing and called for a motion on item RZ-2022-1527.

Alan Patterson asked if a deferral is possible. **Attorney DuBose** stated that SC Code requires that Planning Commission makes a recommendation to Council within 35 days of presentation; applicant can request deferral but at this point a deferral by Planning Commission would be a de facto recommendation for approval.

Motion to approve by A. Patterson; 2nd by T. Neely.

Discussion:

- **A. Patterson** stated his motion was in the interest of an affirmative motion; he does not support the proposal given the problems of access and insufficient roads.
- **T. Neely** stated she hoped the developer would defer, because the proposal is incomplete. She cannot support it under these circumstances.

<u>Called vote</u>: 4:0. **Motion is denied unanimously**.

Chairman Deese stated the item will go to County Council for consideration, and applicant will be notified of time and date.

b. <u>DA-2022-1527 Arbor Walk LLC</u>

Application by Arbor Walk, LLC for a Development Agreement for approximately 112.75 acres located at or adjacent to 2991 Vance Baker Road (TM# 0009-00-015.00 and 0009-00-011.02) to create a 179-lot single-family residential development.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Rox Burhans presented the application consistent with the staff report. <u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Denial.

Questions to staff: none.

Comment from applicant(s):

Chaplain Spencer (Attorney for Developer): Negotiation of the Development Agreement will allow the County to impose restrictions and address improvements.

Questions from Commissioners:

A. Patterson asked at what stage are impact fees assessed? **R. Burhans** stated they are assessed at the time building permits are issued.

Public Hearing: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets)

Frances Liu (continued):

- Traffic calming devices being discussed- e.g. floodlights-- are not wanted by residents and are almost as bad as the problem they intend to solve; they want less traffic.
- Date of TIA was NOT conducted when School was in session, school ended May 27th and the study was conducted in June.

Allen Thiede (Legacy Park):

Opposes the plan to grant access through Legacy Park in exchange for access to amenities: public access to amenities will only worsen the traffic and safety problems.

<u>Tony Iannucci</u> (S. Legacy Park): This development will do irreparable harm to quality of life, and to safety. It will allow other developers access to adjacent tracts and the problem will grow.

Svetlana Efremova (S. Legacy Park): She chose Legacy Park for safety, comfort and beauty. This development will destroy the serenity of the neighborhood.

<u>Richard Thomas</u> (Lilywood Lane): This community is a garden, we do not want a path blasted through it. Consider the safety and protection of the community.

<u>Andrew Smith</u> (S. Legacy Park): Attracted to the neighborhood because it was quiet. Development will destroy the peace, and the two access points less than 100 feet apart is a hazard. Vance Baker is not designed for this volume of traffic.

Chairman Deese called for a response from Applicant:

Jeff Jernigan: No further comments at this time.

Chairman Deese closed Public hearing and called for a motion on item DA-2022-1527.

Motion to approve by A.Patterson; 2nd by T. Neely.

Discussion: None

Called vote: 4:0. Motion is denied unanimously.

Chairman Deese stated the item will go to County Council for consideration, and applicant will be notified of time and date.

c. <u>UDO-TA-2022-0172</u>: Keith Corporation/MUSC

Application by The Keith Corporation on behalf of MUSC to amend Unified Development Ordinance Section 4.3.2, Highway Corridor Overlay District (HCO), paragraph D "Exceptions and non-conforming situations."

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Ashley Davis, Senior Planner, presented the application consistent with the staff report. <u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Denial.

Questions to staff: None.

Comment from applicant(s):

<u>Sam Walker</u> (Charlotte NC) on behalf of MUSC: Overall proposal to build 100 bed hospital on site, which has only about 30 acres of buildable area. This is Phase I of the project, which features 90, 000 sf of medical services office space to be in operation before the hospital is built. It will require a large amount of parking, and current design constraints do not allow the best utilization of the parcel. Take into consideration that the road frontage is 15 feet below the road level. The client has also conceded at staff request a public collection road through the site from Hwy 521 to Henry Harris Road, which creates further constraints on usable space.

Questions from Commissioners: None.

<u>Public Hearing</u>: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets) none signed in.

Chairman Deese closed Public hearing and called for a motion on item UDO-TA-2022-0172

Motion to approve by A. Patterson; 2nd by T. Neely.

Discussion:

A. Patterson made the motion in the interest of having an affirmative motion on the floor.

A. Patterson asked if the applicant bought the property before the HCOD provisions were enacted. **A. Davis** responded that the HCOD was enacted in 2016, well before the applicant bought the property.

Attorney DuBose noted that the overlay district ordinances are public record.

Called vote: 1:3. **Motion is denied**.

Alan Patterson: Against Tamecca Neely: Against Sheila Hinson: For Charles Deese: Against.

Chairman Deese stated the item will go to County Council for consideration, and applicant will be notified of time and date.

d. SD-2022-0733: Century Communities aka Shiloh Woods

Application by Century Communities for Preliminary Plat for four parcels totaling approximately 173.52 acres located at or adjacent to 500 W. Shiloh Unity Road (TM#s 0049-00-004.13, 0049-00-004.16, 0049-00-005.01 and 0049-00-005.02), to allow development of a 398-lot Cluster Subdivision.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Ashley Davis, Senior Planner, presented the applications consistent with the staff report. <u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Proposal is incomplete. No recommendation.

Questions to staff:

C. Deese asked about the reconfiguration of entrances on Shiloh Unity. A. Davis responded that SCDOT recommendation was based on previous layout, and new revision not yet approved; two entrances are required.

Comment from applicant(s):

Ryan Hitchins (Charlotte) for Century Communities: [see slide presentation attached.]

Questions from Commissioners: None.

Public Hearing: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets) None signed in.

Chairman Deese closed Public hearing and called for a motion on item SD-2022-0733.

Alan Patterson asked if it was possible to defer, as the proposal was incomplete. Attorney DuBose responded that the applicant could request deferral; Preliminary Plat approval is made by Commission without referral to Council. Applicant requested deferral if the alternative was denial.

Motion to defer to October 18, 2022 (by request of applicant) by A. Patterson; 2nd by S. Hinson.

Discussion: none.

<u>Called vote</u>: 4:0. **Motion to defer is approved unanimously**.

e. DA-2022-0733: Century Communities aka Shiloh Woods

Application by Century Communities and William Harper for a development agreement for three parcels totaling approximately 19.93 acres located at Williamson Farm Road, and at 500 and 516 W. Shiloh Unity Road (TM#s 0049-00-004.16, 0049-00-005.01 and 0049-00-005.02) to allow development of a 398-lot Cluster Subdivision.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Ashley Davis, Senior Planner, presented the applications consistent with the staff report. <u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Proposal is incomplete. No recommendation.

<u>Comment from applicant(s)</u>: Applicant requested deferral if the alternative was denial.

Public Hearing: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets) None signed in.

f. RZ-2022-1566: Chernyak

Application by Svyatoslav Chernyak to rezone .621 acres located at 9851 Kohut Road, Indian Land (TM# 0006N-0B-009.00) from Medium Density Residential (MDR) to General Business (GB) to allow redevelopment as a commercial property. **APPLICATION WITHDRAWN** [see attached email communication]. Applicant will address code violations and reapply.

g. RZ-2022-1759: King's Mountain LLC (Daycare)

Application by King's Mountain Self-Storage LLC to rezone 4.84 acres (TM# 0013-00-024.00) located at 4263 Doby's Bridge Road, Indian Land, from Low Density Residential (LDR) to Institutional (INS) district, to allow development of a daycare facility.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Matthew Blaszyk, Planner, presented the application consistent with the staff report. <u>Staff Recommendations</u>: Approval.

<u>Called vote</u>: 4:0. **Motion is approved unanimously**.

As of 4:00 PM on 9/20/2022, we had received 38 additional emails representing approximately 41 individuals as well as the Legacy Park HOA. All of the submitted comments took a position requesting <u>denial</u> of the proposed RZ and DA for Arbor Walk.

- 23 comments stated a position against, but had no further detail.
- Many stated concerns regarding <u>traffic congestion</u>, <u>speeding</u> and inadequacy of area <u>roads</u>:
 - 7 general comments
 - 6 regarding Vance Baker
 - 1 regarding S. Legacy Park Dr
 - 1 regarding Goldwing
 - 2 stated concerns with the condition of roads, or future maintenance costs.
- 11 expressed concern for children, pets, pedestrian and/or bicyclist <u>safety</u>, especially with regard to lack of sidewalks.
- 1 expressed concern over <u>damage to local natural habitats</u> including a nearby stream;
- 3 expressed concern over existing or potential school overcrowding.
- 2 objected specifically to the use of the <u>LCWSD pump station parcel</u> as an access point [One was from HOA Attorneys regarding encumbrance for "public purposes."]

I am writing to oppose the rezoning of the proposed Arbor Walk community from LDR to MDR.

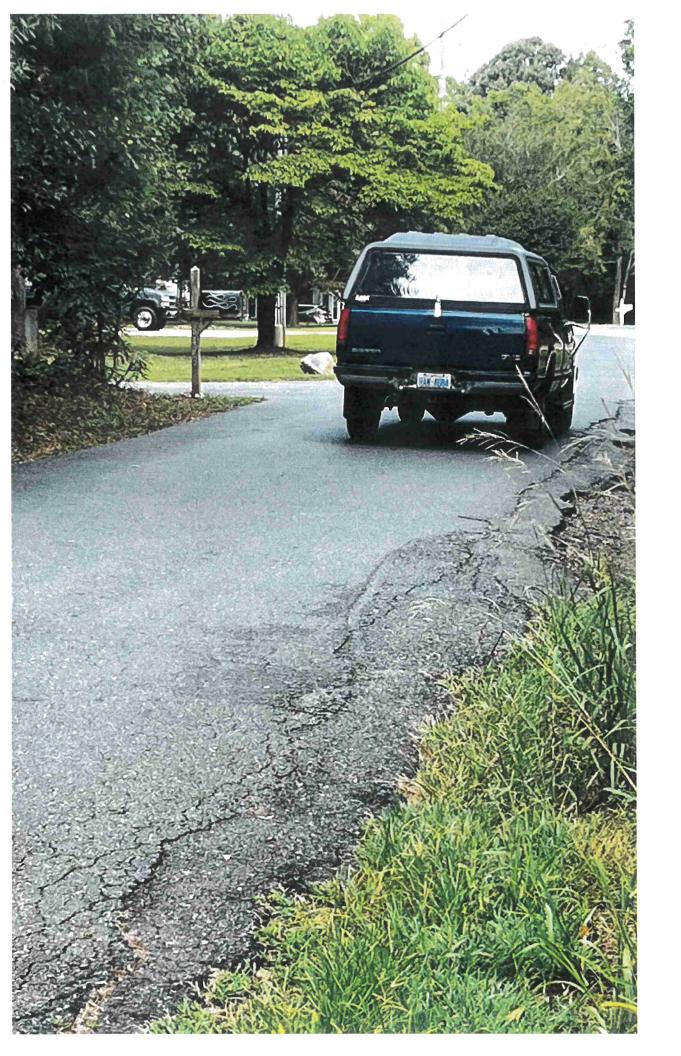
After living in Legacy Park for 11 years, I can safely say that the shortest route from Arbor Walk to Blakeny, Weddington, Waxhaw, Monroe, Matthews, etc will be via Vance Baker Rd. In addition, the preferred route to the Ballantyne area will also be via Vance Baker Rd and Marvin Rd. However, as you can clearly see from the attached photograph, a significant portion of Vance Baker Rd is much too narrow for two vehicles to pass. Any increase in traffic along this portion of Vance Baker Rd without improvements is a bad idea, especially the increased traffic flow that would result from rezoning Arbor Walk from LDR to MDR.

<u>Summary of Arbor Walk RZ/DA-2022-1579 Citizen's Comments:</u> Attachment to 9/20/2022 Agenda

As of 9:00 AM on 9/13/2022, we had received 80 emails representing approximately 95 individuals (some were signed as "family," making actual numbers difficult to assess.) All of the submitted comments took a position requesting **denial** of the proposed RZ and DA for Arbor Walk.

- 33 comments stated a position against but had no further detail.
- Most stated concerns regarding <u>traffic congestion</u> and inadequacy of area roads:
 - o 17 general comments
 - o 26 Vance Baker
 - o 24 S. Legacy Park Dr
 - o 12 Shelly Mullis
 - o 10 Goldwing
 - o 2 Henry Harris
 - 1 Waxhaw-Marvin Rd.
 - o 1 Green Pond Rd
 - 19 stated concerns with the condition of roads, or future maintenance costs.
- 25 expressed concern for children, pets, pedestrian and/or bicyclist <u>safety</u>, especially with regard to lack of sidewalks.
- 9 cited concerns over potential <u>construction disruption</u>: trucks, noise, dirt and runoff.
- 9 expressed concern over <u>damage to local natural habitats</u> including a nearby stream; 3 of these specifically mentioned the Carolina Heelsplitter habitat; 1 was concerned about building in a floodplain.
- 6 expressed concern over existing or potential school overcrowding.
- 3 objected specifically to the use of the <u>LCWSD pump station parcel</u> as an access point.
- 2 expressed concern about capacity of **emergency and safety services**.
- 1 expressed concern about water utility service and <u>water pressure</u>.
- 1 expressed concern that <u>home values</u> would decrease.

We oppose Arbor Walk RZ-2022-1527 and DA-2022-1527. We are residents of the Chastain neighborhood that shares Vance Baker with Legacy park in Indian Land. Please understand, I am not against development. It is absolutely to be expected as a suburb of bustling Charlotte. However, I think there is a responsible and thoughtful way to grow, and a careless money grabbing approach. I fear the Arbor Brook development is leaning toward the greedy side. I have 3 main concerns for the planned development.

- 1. We walk/bike Vance Baker (and surrounding roads) often, but with extreme caution. Since there are no sidewalks, no markings and it is narrow, we have to be very aware of the traffic for safety. We've had a few close calls where large vehicles (mostly delivery drivers) aren't paying attention. Adding 170+ houses with Vance Baker and Goldwing as the street outlets will negatively impact the safety and traffic in an already congested area. In addition, there are many trees adding to low visibility and it can be tricky turning on to Shelly Mullis from these roads. Significant road improvement with sidewalks would be necessary to make this a responsible and safe situation for all the residents how can we work with the county to make sure road improvement is a part of this plan?
- 2. The Indian Land schools already suffer from massive overcrowding. They currently cannot supply enough busses/drivers to keep up with the current need let alone adding that many more children. My children have said that they literally walk shoulder to shoulder in the halls of the middle school between classes they are that crowded. All this irresponsible dense housing without proper school development is weakening our community and hurting our children. It shows that greed and profits are the priority, not our children's future. Can we please slow down the growth until the schools can catch up?
- 3. Much of the greenspace is being destroyed by developers that have no interest in preserving the quality of Indian Land they live elsewhere and this is purely a business transaction. Destroying the greenspace is negatively impacting the wildlife, watershed, and turning a beautiful place to live into a barren landscape of postage stamp lot homes. I wish the planning and preservation of our beautiful county could be more deliberate and not at the mercy of developers squeezing every penny they can from undeveloped land. Can we work to preserve greenspace and incorporate it into the future neighborhoods better instead of wiping it clean to place as many houses as possible?

I currently represent the Legacy Park Homeowners Association, Inc. ("Association"). The Association's community is adjacent to the proposed Arbor Walk development. The Association has asked that I communicate to you on their behalf regarding their concerns with this proposed new development.

It's my understanding that there is a current application for the property for this development to be rezoned from low density residential to medium density residential. The change in zoning will require two access roads into the new development and this has my client greatly concerned. The roads in the area are already overcrowded, have limited visibility and create safety concerns for citizens that live in the area. To increase the density and allow additional traffic over these roads will have a very damaging impact on those residents already living in the area.

It has come to the attention of my client that the two proposed access points to the development would be Vance Baker Road and a possible tie-in to South Legacy Park Boulevard over a parcel of property currently owned by the Lancaster County Water & Sewer District known as parcel 0009-00-001.02 ("LCWSD Parcel"). This LCWSD Parcel was conveyed to the Lancaster County Water & Sewer District for use as a pump station and the LCWSD Parcel is to be used only for public purposes. The conveyance or encumbrance by the Lancaster County Water &

Sewer District of this LCWSD Parcel to a private owner for development of a private residential community is not a public purpose and should not be permitted.

The proposed zoning change and development plans have my clients very concerned since both access points that are being discussed will encroach directly into the Association's established community. For these reasons, the Association strongly requests that you deny the zoning change to medium density residential for this proposed development.

I currently represent the Legacy Park Homeowners Association, Inc. ("Association"). The Association's community is adjacent to the proposed Arbor Walk development. The Association has asked that I communicate to you on their behalf regarding their concerns with this proposed new development.

It's my understanding that there is a current application for the property for this development to be rezoned from low density residential to medium density residential. The change in zoning will require two access roads into the new development and this has my client greatly concerned. The roads in the area are already overcrowded, have limited visibility and create safety concerns for citizens that live in the area. To increase the density and allow additional traffic over these roads will have a very damaging impact on those residents already living in the area.

It has come to the attention of my client that the two proposed access points to the development would be Vance Baker Road and a possible tie-in to South Legacy Park Boulevard over a parcel of property currently owned by the Lancaster County Water & Sewer District known as parcel 0009-00-001.02 ("LCWSD Parcel"). This LCWSD Parcel was conveyed to the Lancaster County Water & Sewer District for use as a pump station and the LCWSD Parcel is to be used only for public purposes. The conveyance or encumbrance by the Lancaster County Water &

Sewer District of this LCWSD Parcel to a private owner for development of a private residential community is not a public purpose and should not be permitted.

The proposed zoning change and development plans have my clients very concerned since both access points that are being discussed will encroach directly into the Association's established community. For these reasons, the Association strongly requests that you deny the zoning change to medium density residential for this proposed development.
