Chairman Deese called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

The agenda was also posted in the lobby of the County Administration Building for the required length of time, and was published on the County website.

Chairman Deese called for a motion to approve the Agenda. Motion to Approve by **James Barnett**; 2nd by **Sheila Hinson**. Called vote: 6:0. **Motion approved unanimously**.

Chairman Deese opened the floor to comments from the public. One Citizens' Comment was submitted via email.

2. **Anthony Haltom** (Pettus Farm Road): Owns one of the subject properties. He and his family entered into agreement with Eastland Homes several years ago, they support the project and would like it to move forward. It has been in limbo long enough.

Chairman Deese closed Citizen's Comments.

4. APPROVE MINUTES

a. March 21, 2023 Regular Minutes

Chairman Deese called for a motion to approve March 21, 2023 Regular Minutes as written. Motion to Approve by **Ben Levine**; 2nd by **James Barnett**. Called vote: 6:0. **Motion approved unanimously.**

b. April 6, 2023 Workshop Minutes

Chairman Deese called for a motion to approve April 6, 2023 Workshop Minutes as written. Tamecca Neely was absent from 4/6/2023 Workshop meeting. Motion to Approve by **Ben Levine**; 2nd by **James Barnett**. Called vote: 6:0. **Motion approved unanimously.**

5. PUBLIC ITEMS

a. SD-2021-2450 Pettus Pond

Application by Eastwood Homes, R. Joe Harris, Jane Pettus and Anthony Haltom for approval of a Preliminary Plat for three parcels totaling approximately 61.24 acres located at or adjacent to #10925 and #10822 Pettus Farm Road and Old Pettus Place, respectively, (TMs 0003-00-051.00, 0003-00-052.00, and 0003-00-052.06), for a single-family residential development of 99 lots.

<u>Staff Presentation</u>: Ashley Davis, Senior Planner, presented the application consistent with the staff report. [See also Slides 2-9 on attached agenda presentation]. Staff Recommendations: Conditional Approval

Staff Conditions:

- Resolution of TRC outstanding comments (Planning, Engineering, and Fire) within 60 days of this meeting;
- Confirmation of potential access to water and sewer service from LCWSD within 60 days of this meeting;
- Resolution of the upgrades needed to Pettus Rd. with County Staff and SCDOT within 60 days of this meeting.

Questions to staff:

Ben Levine: Have staff review comments been addressed?

Davis: Most have been addressed by the revised plan, but a few remain

Ben Levine: Will Pettus Farm Road be improved?

Davis: The TIA does not call for it. The portion forming the entrance to the development will be widened. The rest going out to Barberville Road is still being discussed, and is one of the issues that has to be resolved in the next 60 days.

Public Hearing: (See attachments: Sign-in Sheets)

• **Jody Pettus** (Lexington, NC): Representing Pettus family and reading a statement by Jae Pettus, owner of one of the subject parcels. The project has been on hold and the family's situation in limbo for 3 years; this seems excessive. The farm isinactive; new homes are needed for growth in the area. Mrs. Pettus' health is diminishing and she would like to see the project resolved and moved forward.

Chairman Deese closed Public hearing. Called upon applicant for comments.

Comment from applicant(s):

Brandon Pridemore (R. Joe Harris Engineering): Rezoning was approved in 2021 based on this plan; The plan has been on hold /in discussion ever since. Pettus Farm Road will be resurfaced, but will be 24 feet wide, not 26 feet. Within the subdivision the roads will be wider. Density is 1.6 dua. They have prepared the revised connectivity index and are ready to submit it, it comes in at 1.33 so does not need a waiver.

Allison Hardin: In response to Mr. Pridemore's previous comments, clarification: First, that the rezoning was not approved based on this plan. That is called "Contract Zoning" and is illegal in the State of South Carolina. The rezoning took the plan into consideration, but it is in no way bound to the plan.

Second, describing the Fire Marshall's interpretation of the State Fire Code as "wonky" is incorrect. The Fire Marshall is applying the State Fire Code as it is written, as of January 1st of this year the required road width is 26 feet. We are precluded by state law from overstepping the state requirements.

Questions from Commissioners:

Ben Levine: Expressed concern about the width of Pettus Farm Road and asked for clarification.

Davis and Hardin: The road into the development from the intersection with Camp Cox road is 26 feet, before that it will be 24 feet.

Chairman Deese called for a motion on item SD-2021-2450 Pettus Pond Preliminary Plat **Motion to approve with Staff Conditions** by **Ben Levine**; 2nd by **Sheila Hinson**.

Discussion:

Alan Patterson: Parcel has been rezoned, and he agrees it has been a lengthy process, but this plan seems premature with so many outstanding TRC comments. Roads are insufficient for what is being proposed, that section of Barberville Road is already dangerous and will only be more so with the added traffic. He cannot support the project.

Ashley Davis: The school district comments may need further exploration for future projects; staff will schedule time at a future workshop to discuss school district input.

Called vote: 4:2. **Motion is conditionally approved**.

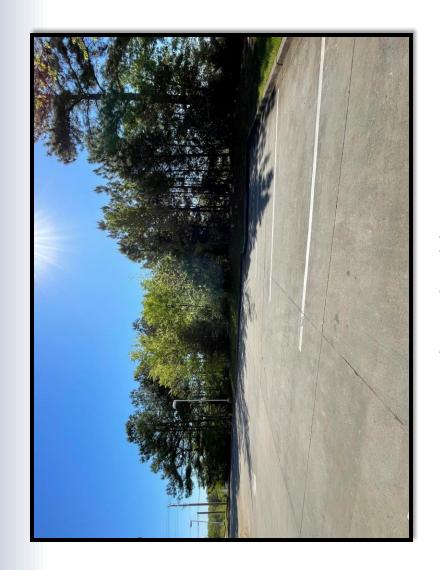

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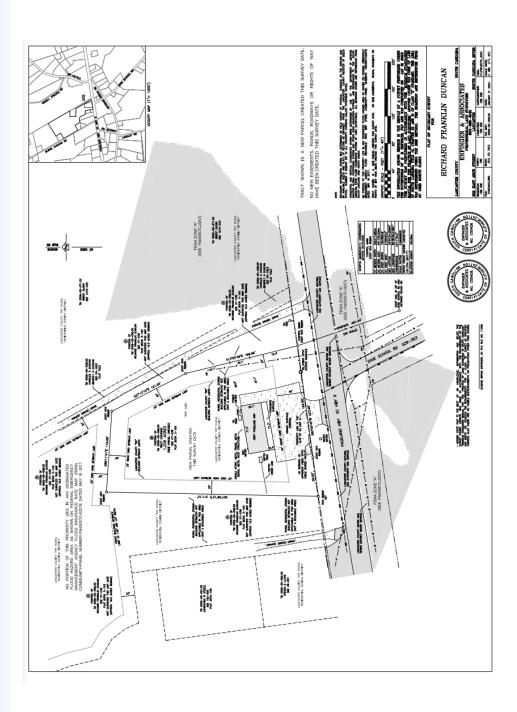
